Today, 72 children in the U.S. will die from complex medical conditions.	In the U.S., the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) tracks causes of deaths ("Mortality"). According to the CDC, 45,187 people under 21 died in 2020. Using CDC mortality data, NCPPCH can identify those children that died from accidents or trauma, separate from complex medical conditions to complete this analysis.
